ORDER

As per the G. Os. read as first and second papers, educational concessions were sanctioned to the Children of defence personnel killed in action during the Indo-Pakistan War of 1971 for study upto Degree Course in Arts & Science Colleges. In the G. Os. read third and fourth papers, certain concessions in the matter of admission in Engineering Colleges and Polytechnics were sanctioned to the children of defence personnel killed in action in Indo-Pakistan War of 1971, and the Indo-Pakistan hostilities of 1965.

2. As per the G. O. read as fifth paper, Government have sanctioned grants to meet hostel charges to the children and widows of officers and men of Defence and para military forces killed or disabled in the Indo-Pakistan conflict of 1971. These concessions were extended to the children and widows of officers and men of armed forces including para military personnel killed or disabled in the 1962 Indo-China Hostilities and the 1965 Indo-Pakistan Hostilities as per G. O. (Ms.) 59/75/Edn., dated 7-4-1975.

3. According to the existing orders the concessions sanctioned in G. O. (Ms.) 28/74/H. Edn., dated 16-2-1974 and G. O. (Ms.) No. 59/75/H. Edn., dated 7-4-1975 are applicable to those studying in Arts & Science Colleges only. In the letters read above the Director of Technical Education and the Secretary, Rajya Sainik Board have recommended that these concessions may be extended to the Professional Colleges also. Government have considered the question in detail and are pleased to order that the Concessions sanctioned in G. O. (Ms.) 28/74/H.Edn. dated 16-2-1974 and G. O. (Ms.) 59/75/H.Edn., dated 7-4-1975 will be extended to the children of Defence Personnel killed in action or disabled in the Indo-China Hostilities of 1962 and Indo-Pakistan hostilities of 1965 and 1971, studying in professional colleges also.
